Yet tourism from Bali is the primary contributor of the over 10 billion US dollars annually attained due to tourism

With over 5 million domestic and 3 million international tourists every year visiting the island

Most foreign tourists flying in from Singapore, China, Malaysia and Japan, with Australia being the number one contributor of tourism in Bali

With little known until the emergence of Buddhism on the island, Buddhist kings of Java seeking to establish Buddhist rule over the island

While the remaining populations were already forming an amalgamation of Buddhism and Hinduism

Stemming from the Hindus of the Indian subcontinent migrating through Southeast Asia

Shortly after the first known European contact with Bali

Though it would only be in 1597 that the Dutch effectively established a line of communications

The Dutch soon asserting their dominion over the Balinese under the pretext of abolishing opium smuggling, arms running and piracy

While they themselves traded rice, cattle and female slaves in exchange for opium

Balinese kings, or rajas, selling opponents, debtors, criminals or even orphans and widows as slaves in exchange for drugs

Slaves that were shipped to Dutch households in what was then known as Batavia, now Jakarta

The Dutch colonialism further assisted by the constant strife existing between the different indigenous Balinese kingdoms

Leading to mass suicides of the conquered people

Rather than face the humiliation of defeat and submission

The Netherlands as a whole garnering significant criticism for their brutality in the region

Leading to Dutch officials announcing the establishment of "Ethical policy"

Wherein certain individuals were designated protectors of Balinese culture, under the pretense of both preserving it in the face of increased westernization of the island as well as leading the way in the modernization of Bali

While the actual reasons behind it was to solidify Dutch imperial rule

As well as opening it up for additional tourism revenue as Bali was first opened for tourism in 1914

For the decades to come, Bali became increasingly economically dependent on tourism

Touted as a tropical paradise

Lasting until the Japanese occupation of the island during World War II

After which, the Balinese and Indonesian militias continued their struggle against the Dutch rule who sought to reestablish itself in the region following the fall of Imperial Japan

Eventually leading to their independence as part of the United States of Indonesia in 1949

The initial post-war years being marked tumultuous as conflicts arose throughout Indonesia as to the validity of the government and the conflicting views of the Balinese caste system

Itself an emulation of the Indian castes, or strict social hierarchies

Between the lower castes such as the Shudras, the peasants making up 90% of the Balinese population,

Transforming Bali overnight into a boomtown

Wherein the Balinese promptly rejected historical and cultural links to the rest of Indonesia in favor of Hindu-Buddhist and indigenous traditions

Militant Islamists violently opposing these developments, leading to multiple terrorist attacks against tourist resorts in and around Kuta

Killing hundreds of foreigners

Though only succeeding in temporarily lessening the influx of foreign currency into the island

With tourism recovering fully within the span of 3 years

The southern areas of Bali, including the provincial capital of Denpasar

Sanur

Nusa Dua and Pecatu, are today the main tourist attractions of Bali

Though the constant deforestation, pollution and overdevelopment of the island due to tourism has instead become the primary issue affecting the islanders

Calling into question the long-term sustainability of the island's primary industry

Bali has become the center of tourism in Indonesia

But the ever increasing land developments have also led to significant deforestation of much of Bali's delicate ecology

700 hectares of land each year converted into roads along the tourist resorts, high-class hotels and luxury residences targeted to rich foreigners

Several species turning extinct due either to loss of habitat, pollution or hunting

So-called shikari hunting trips, hunting for sport, putting an end to both the Balinese leopard and the Bali tiger during the early 20th century

While Indian elephants have been introduced as both labor animals

Employed to tear down vegetation to make room for the rice terraces

And as a tourist attractions

Despite that the elephants are often visibly maltreated

The process of training an elephant often appearing harmful and cruel to the animal

The extensive farming has changed much of the ecosystem and terrain of Bali

Of not only rice but the highly specialized form of coffee known as Kopi Luwak, or civet coffee

Where Asian palm civets are farmed to forcibly digest coffee berries in order to ferment it in their digestive tract

Selling it as one of the world's most expensive and highly valued coffees, sold to tourists and exported abroad

Though the practice is rife with fraud, particularly with unknowing tourists

And when it is genuine, the production of it is often plagued by animal cruelty

Tourism has also significantly changed the behaviors of the indigenous monkey, the crab-eating macaque

Having grown so accustomed to receiving food from tourists that they have resorted to begging rather than trying to acquire food the natural way

While the rich Coral reefs off the coast of Bali are also increasingly threatened by the influence of tourism

Also due to fishing, either industrial, with many sea turtles and sharks getting caught in fishermen's nets

Or for sport

Many foreign fishermen sailing to Balinese waters to catch some of the hundreds of species unique to the reefs

With legal restrictions often being vague or even non-existent

The acidification of the waters due to pollution is however reported to be the biggest threat to the reefs

With the dumping of garbage and chemical waste being a major factor

The reefs today reported to have a coverage level of a mere 36% of healthy coral, sparking a chain reaction throughout the entire ecosystem

The garbage situation is fast becoming another major threat to the Balinese ecology

Each day nearly 500,000 cubic feet of trash is reportedly generated by tourists

Of which, less than half is recycled

Much of it being non-biodegradable and potentially harmful for nearby animals

The beaches of Bali now also face significant erosion due to tourism

Lebih Beach, formerly a significant site of holy pilgrimages, loses up to 23 feet of land every year

200 out of the 400 rivers running through the island reported to have dried up in the past decade to provide water for tourism

Leaving the south of Bali soon facing a serious water shortage

Each room of an average four star hotel in Bali estimated to consume 300 liters a day

The division of rich and poor clearly delineated between lines of luxury cars along the high end hotels

A sharp contrast to the majority of the indigenous population

Many of which still lack electricity or running water

With a large majority of Balinese children reported to only able to get partial or substandard public education

Instead relying on begging, stealing and selling handcrafts or even stolen goods on the street

Or by taking employment in one of the many sweatshops or construction sites employing child labor

The communal Balinese society often requiring children to work or participate in village activities

Thanks to the Hindu concept of dharma, or obligation to sacrifice effort for the greater good

Many Balinese children required to drive and seek employment as soon as they are considered old enough

Often abused to great extent in the name of furthering tourism on the island

The drug trade being particularly popular among tourists of Bali

Children often used as runners or couriers

A low-grade heroin, known as putauw, widely available

Resulting in frequent overdoses

As well as more common party drugs distributed by dealers and bartenders in bars and clubs

Or at the beach

As every night, the entire beach of Kuta turns into a giant party for all to join

Small-time dealers occasionally seen along street corners and near hotels selling "magic mushrooms", powerful hallucinogenics

These cases are however a minor scourge compared to the large-scale drug trafficking allegedly occurring between Bali and primarily Australia

Their close proximity and Bali's status as a world-class tourist destination enabling many big time drug smugglers location and opportunity to smuggle heroin

As Indonesia is often used as a gateway of opiates coming from the Golden Triangle

With tourists sometimes reported as getting caught up in the trade

Despite drug trafficking being an offense punishable by death in Indonesia

The infrastructure of Bali suffers significantly due to the high demands of the increasing tourist population

Nearly all major roads being highly congested and poorly maintained

200 00:18:38:24 00:18:41:14

While hotels are often overbooked and crowded

The beaches themselves often covered from end to end with sunbathers, surfers and swimmers

Leading to more and more developers tearing down the rainforest in favor of more resorts

While the central government has made several attempts at lessening the harmful effects of tourism

Including posing strict restrictions on new construction of hotels and resorts

These laws have gone unheeded as the decentralized government of Indonesia lends much power to the local provincial prefects

Many of which oppose any such restrictions from being applied in practice

Stemming from the sole interest in profiting from the sudden influx of tourism

Without considering the long-term effects

The largest threat to Bali however remains sex tourism

At least 40 000 tourists yearly soliciting sex from prostitutes in Bali

It is widely practiced, tolerated and regulated with widespread corruption among law enforcement to turn the other way or even to support it

Frequently tourists visiting the island will during their first minutes after arrival enter a taxi where the driver will inquire if you are interested in sex massage

Leading them to massage parlors known by innocuous names, primarily located in the city of Sanur

Known as lokalisasi, specialized prostitution complexes filled with hundreds of women known by number rather than name

Many developing significant sexually transmitted diseases as less than one third of all sex acts committed with prostitutes are done with protection

Recent estimates stating that over a quarter of all prostitutes in Bali are now suspected of being HIV positive

800 new cases reported every year

Often reluctant to inform clients so as not to lose business

Some are even systematically abused by foreign clients as they are unwilling to go to the authorities

Others are freelance prostitutes

Many found in bars and clubs throughout Bali

Many older, wealthy foreign women also specifically traveling to Bali for the purpose of soliciting sex from young Balinese men

Known as Kuta Cowboys

224 00:21:13:12 00:21:17:15

Frequently not only charging money up front but also requesting gifts

225 00:21:19:00 00:21:22:09

Ranging from clothes, food and apartment rentals

To electronic devices and motorbikes

227 00:21:28:09 00:21:32:21

Continuing with financial support for months after their benefactor has left the island

228 00:21:34:13 00:21:39:03

Japanese women visiting Bali reported to be the biggest target group for the Cowboys

229 00:21:42:11 00:21:46:07

With the island being a significant destination for child sex tourists

230 00:21:47:23 00:21:51:19

30 percent of all prostitutes in Bali being reported as underage

231 00:21:53:01 00:21:58:13

Over 8000 children reported to be exploited by foreigners on a daily basis in Bali alone

Many of which are sold into the sex trade by their family or friends

Bolstered by a low level of awareness of pedophilia reported among local authorities

Though many faults can be found within the local government

In the end they follow the basic principle of commercialism

To meet consumer demands whenever possible

With the real Bali losing its identity along the way
